1. Why? Context

EEA and Norwegian Financial Mechanisms 2014-2021 \bullet

- €2.8 billion across 15 beneficiary countries
- Civil society one of 5 priority sectors
- Specific priorities in each beneficiary country set out in Memorandum of Understanding
- EEA Agreement: minimum 10% country allocation for civil society
- Reflects donor commitment to support civil society

Active Citizens Fund

- EEA Agreement and Regulation for FM 2014-21:
- Fund Operator directly contracted by FMO, autonomous of government
- FMO is Programme Operator
- Programme Implementation Agreement between FMO and FO

Civil society and active citizenship strengthened and vulnerable groups empowered



2. What? What can be supported?

Areas of Support

1. Democracy, active citizenship, good governance and transparency

2. Human rights and equal treatment through combating any discrimination on the grounds of racial or ethnic origin, religion or belief, gender, disability, age, sexual orientation or gender identity

3. Social justice and inclusion of vulnerable groups

4. Gender equality and gender-based violence

5. Environment and climate change





2. What?

Regional Civil Society Initiatives and Bilateral Funds

- Regional Civil Society Initiatives
 - sector across the beneficiary countries
- Fund for Bilateral Relations
 - the beneficiary countries and in the donor countries

Promote regional exchange and networking with a view to strengthening civil society

Strengthening bilateral relations between civil society organisations and other entities in

2. What?

Capacity building

- Developing long-term sustainability and capacity, with the aim of helping civil society achieve and sustain effective impact
 - Level of the sector: can include support to networking and partnerships across civil society, policy and advocacy, research etc
 - Level of individual NGOs: organisational development, as well as support to project preparation and implementation
- Minimum 15% re-granting funds for capacity development and sustainability; and
- Capacity development should be integrated across the programme

3. Who? What are we looking for?

- Knowledge of civil society in the beneficiary country
- Experience and a vision for capacity building of the sector
- Re-granting experience

- When evaluating bids, we look for:
 - Competence, expertise and experience of staff and organisations • Management set-up of consortium reflecting strategic partnership between lead and co-bidders. Extra points for new partners and new lead Programme description and justification that shows a clear, logical and well justified response to the challenges of the sector

3. Who?

Eligibility for the role of Fund Operator

- All organisations submitting bid must: Be legal entities established in the EEA; and

 - Be non-governmental; and
 - Form a consortium; and
 - Be financially sustainable; and
 - Have civil society sector experience
- Lead bidder must:
 - Be non-profit making with a non-commercial purpose
- At least one organisation must:
 - Have re-granting experience
 - Have experience in capacity building



Active Citizens Fund in Slovenia

4. Where?

Active Citizens Fund in Slovenia

Total allocation:

- Memorandum of Understanding signed 17 April 2018 Allocation to Slovenia: EUR 19,9 million Allocation to the Active Citizens Fund in Slovenia: EUR 3 million

Country-specific concerns:

- Strengthen the capacity and sustainability of the civil society sector Improve outreach to under-served geographic areas and target
- groups
- Empowerment and inclusion of vulnerable groups, including Roma and migrants
